





ABSENTEEISM


- Frequent absenteeism impacts negatively on learner academic performance. If learners were on the day the learner returns after being absent, is required. Frequent absenteeism will be absent they have to enquire about the work missed and in their own time, catch up. A letter monitored
- If absent for 3 days or longer: a doctor's note is required
- During formal assessment/test/exams: a medical note is compulsory a "0" mark will be given if not handed in..
- Frequent absenteeism will be followed up especially on Fridays/Mondays.
- Absenteeism for 10 days without notification learner will be removed from the register and will have to re-apply for admission.
- Communicate with the register teacher or phone the school to convey message to teacher.
- Sick learners: Do not send learners who are feeling ill, to school. When children have a contagious disease like measles, mumps, etc. keep them at home
- Learners with lice, nits must be kept at home while the infestation is treated.



MEDICATION






